(I Can't Get No) Satisfaction

The prophets Jagger and Richards once wrote:

I can't get no satisfaction, 'cause I try, and I try, and I try, and I try

When I'm watchin' my TV and a man comes on and tells me How white my shirts can be But, he can't be a man 'cause he doesn't smoke the same cigarettes as me

The Sunday after Christmas, the pastor at my church used the repeated phrase to emphasize and carry along his sermon:

Was it enough? Christmas, I mean.

Originally, for 2022, my One Word was going to be, again, 'Grateful'. But, over the last couple of weeks, and with our pastor's 'tag line' repeating in my head, it's been on my heart that I need to change it to 'Satisfied'. That, then, provides the topic for this week ... being satisfied.

## Scripture:

- Ecclesiastes 3:12-13

   I perceived that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live; 13 also that everyone should eat and drink and take pleasure in all his toil—this is God's gift to man.
- Ecclesiastes 4:7-8

7 Again, I saw vanity under the sun: 8 one person who has no other, either son or brother, yet there is no end to all his toil, and his eyes are never satisfied with riches, so that he never asks, "For whom am I toiling and depriving myself of pleasure?" This also is vanity and an unhappy business.
